



DENNIS BIER, MD EARLY CAREER EDITOR POSITION FOR *THE AMERICAN JOURNAL OF CLINICAL NUTRITION*

The American Society for Nutrition Foundation is seeking applicants for the next Dennis Bier, MD Early Career Editor for *The American Journal of Clinical Nutrition*. The Early Career Editor is tasked with translating journal content through social media and assisting with the development of clinical content for health care professionals through a new journal feature, *Nutrition for the Clinician*.

In January 2019, Dennis Bier, MD retired as Editor-of-Chief of *The American Journal of Clinical Nutrition*, a position he had expertly led for over a decade. Dr. Bier's commitment to evidence-based practice in nutrition was unrivaled and through this early career editor position, the ASN Foundation aims to extend his legacy to future generations.

The deadline for applications is **January 18, 2023**.

Responsibilities

- The Early Career Editor will help shape this position to promote and expand journal content to target audiences, particularly health care professionals. This person will assist *AJCN* editors with the launch of a new feature, *Nutrition for the Clinician*, that will provide case-based learning of practical topics in clinical nutrition.
- Lead activities to increase social media engagement for the *AJCN*. Other potential activities include blog posts; an online journal club for graduate, medical and allied healthcare trainees; graphical abstracts; video creation; etc.
- Assist with journal editorial processes, including acting as a peer review/editor.

The Early Career Position will work collaboratively with Kevin Klatt, PhD, RD, the inaugural Dennis Bier MD Early Career Editor, to broaden the reach of journal content.

Compensation & Term

- \$2,500 annual stipend
- Up to \$1,500 annually to support travel/registration to ASN annual NUTRITION meeting
- Reimbursement for travel and accommodations for an orientation with senior editors
- Term: June 2023 – May 2025

Eligibility

Applicants must be/have:

- A junior faculty, physician/resident or other early career professional with an interest in nutrition science and/or clinical nutrition (within 10 years of terminal degree)
- Demonstrated experience in nutrition research and/or practice
- Publishing experience
- Excellent writing skills

- Enthusiasm for clinical pedagogy and case-based learning
- Experience in science communications
- Familiarity with social media platforms (e.g., Twitter, Facebook, YouTube)

- Applicant contact information
- Letter of recommendation
- Author contact information
- A statement of interest that includes applicant's goals for the position and experience publishing and promoting nutrition science and practice (750-word limit)
- Required uploads:
 - A curriculum vitae
 - Two letters of recommendation
 - An example of a work product such as a blog post, social media post, other writing job, infographic, other visual arts project, video, etc. in PDF format. *Note: All uploads to the ASN Foundation Application Portal must be PDF documents. If you are highlighting a video or podcast in your application, please provide a brief description of the work product and link(s).*
